St Helena's Catholic Primary School endeavours to:

1 to 1 digital learning provides your child access to their own device in an online environment, allowing students to learn at their own pace and ability levels. In the 1 to 1 iPad Program, students' access to a technological device and the Internet enables them to be self-directed and receive personalised instruction. Teachers have the opportunity to create targeted learning plans for each student, addressing their unique needs. Students use their personal devices to do research, homework, solve problems critically and creatively, complete team projects, collaborate and access curriculum content. At the same time, they gain valuable 21st Century skills that will be beneficial throughout their lives and careers.

Provision of access to their device, both at school and home, makes it possible for students to access a wider array of resources to support their learning, to communicate with peers and their teachers, and to become fluent in their use of the technological tools of the 21st Century workplace. A 1 to 1 device environment supports a dynamic and interactive learning space. It enables teachers and students to work in a collaborative, online, interconnected community. Each student having their own personal device affords the opportunity to enter a new world of curriculum possibilities, allowing authentic engagement and involvement in their learning.



ACCEPTABLE STUDENT USE

Each child will be asked to read, understand, sign and adhere to the ICT Use by Students Guidelines at the beginning of each year.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES AND INFORMATION

With each student having access and control of their device, excellent opportunities and learning experiences will be available to them. However, with any new opportunity comes significant responsibility. The school needs to clearly articulate to each student their responsibilities in relation to:

- Respecting each individual's privacy and dignity (i.e., cyber safety issues)
- Using the device for appropriate purposes
- Protecting and caring for their device
- Getting the balance correct in relation to educational and social priorities
- Using technology at St Helena's is a privilege, not a right.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION & INSURANCE

Insurance Excess

Please note parents are responsible for all excess regardless of how damage was incurred. Any repairs that are less than the cost of the excess will be charged to parents e.g., screen repairs. Excess is \$150 which is payable every time a repair is carried out. If breakage is due to misuse of the device, the student's access to the device will be limited for a period of time at the discretion of the teacher and/or the leadership team.

Program Cost

The program cost is listed in the school fee schedule and will be collected as part of each family's annual school fee charges. Please note, this is a complete program cost that includes all hardware, software, insurance and support.

DISTRIBUTING AND RETURNING THE DEVICE

Parents/Caregivers and students must sign and return the Program Agreement before the device can be issued to the student. The Program Agreement & Acceptable Use Guidelines outline the appropriate way to use and protect the device. This will be available at the time the device is collected.

If a student terminates enrolment during the school year, the device will be returned to St Helena's at that time. If a student fails to return the device upon termination of enrolment at St Helena's Catholic Primary School, the student's parents/caregivers will be subject to the replacement cost of the device, or, if applicable, any insurance excess. Parents/Caregivers will be charged a fee for any needed repairs, not to exceed the replacement cost of the device.

Parents/Caregivers will be informed of the arrangements for returning the device at the conclusion of the program. Devices will not be available to purchase.



INAPPROPRIATE USE

It is unacceptable for students to: download, distribute, or publish offensive messages or pictures; use obscene or abusive language to harass, insult or attack others; deliberately waste printing and internet resources; damage devices, printers or the network equipment; violate copyright laws which includes plagiarism; use unsupervised internet chat or use the device to connect to any social media network.

Username and passwords must be kept by the student and not divulged to any other individual (other than their teacher and parents/caregiver). Students cannot use another student's or staff member's username or password to the internet for completing the set task or for the duration a student should have access to the internet (e.g. during schools' hours, outside of school hours).

St Helena's Catholic Primary School will provide information in relation to student access and usage of its network and reserves the right to restrict/remove student access to the internet or network facilities if parents/caregivers or students do not adhere to the guidelines.

It is the student's responsibility to ensure the device is brought to school fully charged each day.

Inappropriate use will be considered a serious breach of protocols and dealt with on a one on one basis by the school School's Leadership Team



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How often will the device be used?

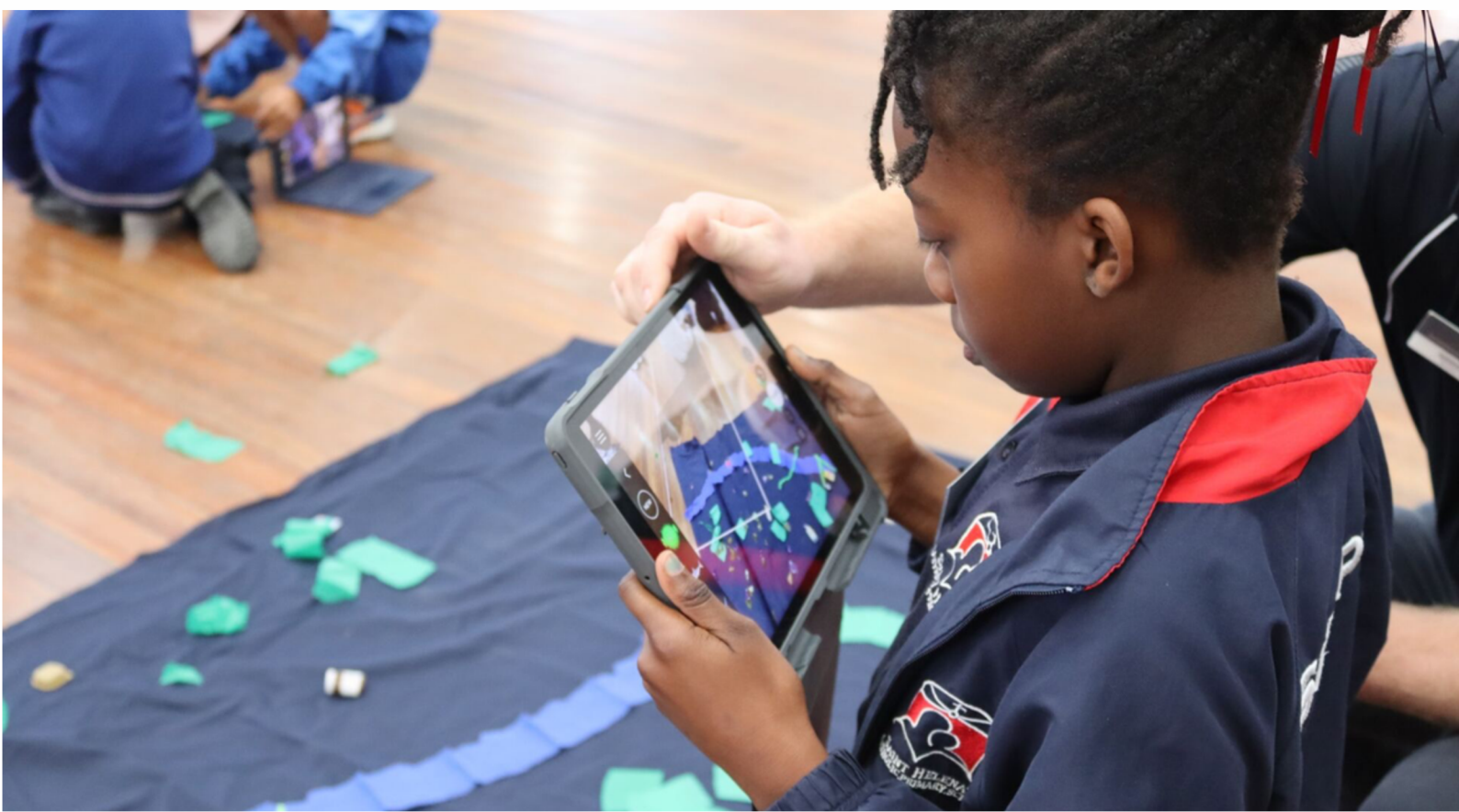
The nature of the 1 to 1 environment is that students will have their device with them and available for use throughout the school day. This does not mean though that they will be used in every lesson. Like other learning tools, the use of the device will depend on the particular learning activity, and this is at the discretion of the teacher. Activities will blend with others such as writing, reading, discussion, debate and testing and students will find that their use of device will vary from day to day. Other subjects will still receive the appropriate allocation of time and resources.

Will the device have Internet access from home?

The school will provide Internet access when at school with appropriate filtering policies. Parents/Caregivers are responsible for providing Internet access at home if they wish. The school strongly encourages that any internet use is conducted in an open environment and monitored at all times. Parents are provided access to JAMF Parent to assist in supervising the iPad when used outside of school hours.

Who owns the device?

The device and accessories remain the property of St Helena's Catholic Primary School. This provides the best cost option for the 1 to 1 Program for parents when the unit, insurance, warranty and app components are combined. All students are expected to adhere to the Acceptable Use Guidelines. Students who breach the guidelines which have been agreed to and signed by both parents/caregivers and students, will not be able to take home their device for a length of time as deemed appropriate by the School's Leadership Team.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who will pay for and install the apps?

The school will pay for and distribute the apps via Jamf. This model allows easy distribution by the classroom teacher and access to Apple Volume Education Pricing for Apps.

Where will students charge their devices?

It is the student's responsibility to ensure that their device battery is fully charged at home each night. iPad chargers are to be kept at home. Parents/Caregivers will be informed by the teacher if uncharged devices are being brought to school as this can affect the educational program.

When will my child receive their device?

Students will be provided with their device as soon as they are available and after the required agreements are signed.

What about data loss?

As we are all aware, devices can "lose" data. Schools often stipulate that students are responsible for ensuring their data is backed up using the correct method. Students will be shown how to initiate and regularly check that their device is being backed up via cloud backups. Students will receive cloud storage space for their school documents through the 365 Suite and Apple iCloud.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I see my child's work?

It is recognised that it is important for parents/caregivers to be involved in all aspects of their child's work and parents/caregivers are encouraged to regularly spend time with their child asking them to explain the work on the device. Parents/Caregivers must also have full access to both the device and their child's work. The school asks that all students make passwords/passcodes available to parents. Parents/Caregivers who have difficulties in accessing their child's work for any reason should contact the classroom teacher.

Can my child install their own apps?

Students are not permitted to install or delete any apps other than those stipulated by the school and/or classroom teacher.

Parents and Caregivers are provided with access to JAMF Parent - a program that allows Parents and Caregivers to monitor access to their child's device





JAMF Parent



JAMF Parent is a free app you can use to manage your child's school-issued iPad. Using JAMF Parent, you can manage your child's school-issued iPad with the following features:

Allow and restrict apps

Enable App Lock to set a timer for app restrictions

You can add your child's iPad to JAMF Parent by scanning a QR code on your child's device.

1. Download JAMF Parent from the App Store on an iPhone, iPad or device running Android.
2. On your child's school-issued device, tap the JAMF Student App.
3. Select the "gear" at the top right side of the application to access the settings.
4. Select Authorise parent. A QR code will open on your child's iPad.
5. Open the "JAMF Parent" App on your personal device.
6. Select the "Scan QR Code" button and scan the QR code displayed on your child's iPad.
7. Your child's iPad will appear in your JAMF Parent app, ready for you to control. By clicking on your child's name in you JAMF Parent app you can decide what apps your child can use/have access to, lock them onto an application and even set restrictions based on a time curfew.
